

USF Coalition Welcomes President Trump's- mediated ceasefire and 20-Point Gaza Peace Plan



The **Uniting for a Shared Future coalition**, bringing together more than 500 Israeli and Palestinian leaders from politics, security, business, media, and civil society, **welcomes today's ceasefire announcement and the plan outlined by President Trump** to end the war in Gaza and open a path to recovery, security, and long-term stability. In a moment of deep loss, trauma, and regional volatility, we commend the leadership of President Trump and the roles of Qatar, Turkey and Egypt in mediating this agreement. The 20-point peace plan offers a concrete opening to stop the bloodshed, secure the release of hostages and humanitarian access, and begin rebuilding lives with dignity. Its regionally coordinated approach, coupled with international guarantees and oversight, **aligns with the core logic of our Political Roadmap and Call to Action**, which were shaped through consultation and cross sector dialogue among coalition members, regional and international partners.

We especially welcome several critical elements which resonate with our coalition's roadmap and that, if implemented fully and credibly, would mark a meaningful turning point:

- ❑ An immediate release of all hostages coupled with a definitive end to the war.
- ❑ The full and immediate resumption of humanitarian aid and access, including by the United Nations and its agencies and the Red Crescent.
- ❑ Firm guarantees against annexation and forced displacement, and no return to an untenable pre-October 7 status quo.
- ❑ The establishment of a temporary transitional governance structure, led by qualified Palestinians under international and regional supervision.
- ❑ Provisions for the demilitarization of Gaza, ending the influence and role of Hamas and all non-state armed groups through an internationally and regionally coordinated and independently monitored process, with the dismantlement of all of military and offensive infrastructures, so that it poses no threat to its neighbours.
- ❑ The deployment of a temporary International Stabilization Force and the training of Palestinian police forces by the ISF in consultation with Egypt and Jordan, recognizing this police force as Gaza's long term internal security solution upon the end of the ISF's mandate.
- ❑ Support for the Palestinian Authority's reform efforts, as part of a pathway to achieving Palestinian self-determination and statehood.
- ❑ A robust economic recovery and reconstruction plan that restores essential services and creates jobs and opportunity, that mobilizes regional and private sector investments and expertise to create real opportunities for the benefit of the people of Gaza and the region.
- ❑ The decision to establish a dialogue between Israelis and Palestinians to agree on a political horizon, and to establish an interfaith dialogue process based on the values of tolerance and peaceful coexistence.

The USF coalition stands ready to support the success of this plan. To help translate this vision into reality, we are preparing a complementary set of practical proposals aimed at enhancing implementation, effectiveness, and success, reinforcing public legitimacy, and sustaining national, regional, and international buy-in.

We view this moment as a unique opportunity to bridge political will with grounded implementation. The USF coalition was formed to serve precisely such moments, when bold diplomacy needs trusted networks, credible and pragmatic leaders, cross sector expertise, and a shared vision to succeed. We reaffirm our readiness to work with the U.S. administration and regional partners to translate momentum into practical operationalisation and movement, and to ensure that this opportunity becomes a lasting achievement for both peoples and the broader region.
